Organ Recital Series Our Summer Organ Series is on Friday lunchtimes (1310–1350) and runs every week until the end of August. Summer Guided Tours and Churchyard Tours During the summer guided tours will take place every Monday at 1230 (except 29 Aug). They will also take place every day of the Commonwealth Games from 28 July–8 Aug (except 7 August). Tours last 30 minutes and tell the story of a church that became a cathedral, in a town that became a city.

Tours of the Churchyard highlighting people, features, and monuments will take place at 1600 on 28 July, 4 Aug, 11 Aug and 18 Aug and last an hour.

Pop Up Divine Beauty Dramatic Performances Witness a short pop up performance piece daily in Cathedral Square 4 to 8 Aug, usually at approximately 1200, 1300 and 1400 on those weekdays, and approximately 1400, 1500, and 1600 on Sunday 7 August, with the characters of Burne-Jones, William Morris, architect JA Chatwin and benefactor Emma Villiers-Wilkes discussing the content and design of the Burne-Jones windows. The service is at 1530 in the cathedral, with a rehearsal for participants 1300–1500. If you would like to join the choir that will be assembled for this service, please book your place by emailing music@moseleychurch.org.uk before 5 September and bring £3 cash on the day – this goes to the RSCM to help defray costs and support their work. Please note that children under 18 must be accompanied by a supervising adult. The service itself will be open to the public and everyone is welcome to attend (no booking required).
