Racial Justice Sunday On Sunday 11 February we mark Racial Justice Sunday and are delighted to welcome The Reverend Calvert Prentis, Diocesan Director of Ordinands and Vocations Development, as our preacher at the 0900 service of Holy Communion and 1100 Choral Eucharist.

Ash Wednesday Ash Wednesday this year falls on 14 February and marks the beginning of the season of Lent. There will be the opportunity to receive the Imposition of Ashes during the three Eucharists that day: 0800 Holy Communion (following 0740 Morning Prayer); the 1310 Holy Communion in traditional language; and the 1945 Choral Eucharist.

Lent Course This year's Lent Course will be on Forgiveness and led by Canon Andy and Revd Colleen. It will take place on Zoom on Thursday evenings from 1930–2100: 22 and 29 February, 7 and 14 March, finishing with a Quiet Day in the cathedral on Saturday 16 March from 1030–1500.
