The Ministry of Wholeness and Healing The Ministry of Wholeness and Healing will be available in the north aisle during today's Choral Eucharist and on the fourth Sunday of the month February–October in 2024. This ministry is not an alternative to medical care but is a way of commending ourselves into God's hands, seeking the deep wholeness, healing and peace that come from him and reconciling ourselves to his loving purposes. This simple rite will be offered by the clergy, with designated members of the congregation available for pastoral conversations and prayer after the service, as you wish. Patronal Festival Wednesday I May is the Feast of St Philip and St James, and the cathedral's Patronal Festival. Ascension Day In addition to our regular services on Thursday 9 May, there will be a Choral Eucharist at 1945 to celebrate Ascension Day. We are very pleased to welcome as our preacher The Reverend Canon Steve Jones, Assistant Priest at St Stephen the Martyr, Rednal; The Bishop of Birmingham's Adviser on Disabilities; and an Honorary Canon of Birmingham Cathedral. If weather permits, the Cathedral Choir will also sing for a few minutes outside the cathedral shortly after 1930. Everyone is most welcome.

Christian Aid Week Christian Aid week this year runs from May 12 to 18 inclusive. Our bucket (and QR/electronic) collection will take place in Cathedral Square Monday to Friday from 0800 until 1800, slightly less on the Saturday, volunteers permitting of course. Last year 24 of us were out there collecting at various times during the week and we forwarded over £4,000 to Christian Aid - 75% of that in cash – up on £3,500 in 2022. Well done to all – both for practical aid and visibility of the cause the effort is very worthwhile. The focus of this year's week will be Burundi, but aid is used wherever it is needed in the world.

BRIEF GUIDELINES OF THE ROLE AND DUTIES OF THE CATHEDRAL COMMUNITY COMMITTEE [subject to the Cathedral's current (2023) Constitution & Statutes]
