Ascension Day In addition to our regular services on Thursday 9 May, there will be a Choral Eucharist at 1945 to celebrate Ascension Day. We are very pleased to welcome as our preacher The Reverend Canon Steve Jones, Assistant Priest at St Stephen the Martyr, Rednal; The Bishop of Birmingham's Adviser on Disabilities; and an Honorary Canon of Birmingham Cathedral. If weather permits, the Cathedral Choir will also sing for a few minutes outside the cathedral shortly after 1930. Everyone is most welcome.

Recital Series On Friday 10 May we have another special lunchtime recital (1310–1350). Associate Artists from the Welsh National Opera (WNO) Beca Davies (Mezzo); Emily Christina Loftus (soprano) and Marlowe Fitzpatrick (accompanist) present a varied programme including works by Vivaldi, Vaughan Williams and Bizet. Like all our lunchtime recitals, it is free to attend (though we suggest a donation of £5 if you are able).

Christian Aid Week Christian Aid week this year runs from May 12 to 18 inclusive. Our bucket (and QR/electronic) collection will take place in Cathedral Square Monday to Friday from 0800 until 1800, slightly less on the Saturday, volunteers permitting of course. Last year 24 of us were out there collecting at various times during the week and we forwarded over £4,000 to Christian Aid -75% of that in cash – up on £3,500 in 2022. Well done to all – both for practical aid and visibility of the cause the effort is very worthwhile. The focus of this year's week will be Burundi, but aid is used wherever it is needed in the world.



BRIEF GUIDELINES OF THE ROLE AND DUTIES OF THE CATHEDRAL COMMUNITY COMMITTEE

[subject to the Cathedral's current (2023) Constitution & Statutes]

Community Committee - It shall meet at least three times a year and will advise the Chapter on all matters affecting the Parish and the Cathedral community. The Chapter may delegate to the committee such functions, powers and duties relating to the Cathedral community as Chapter may determine.
